
**Eight-foot circle** – the line (8' radius) encircling the pitcher's rubber is not a component of the pitching delivery rules. If the pitcher has control of the ball in the circle, and a time-out has **NOT** been called, all base-runners not occupying a base must immediately advance/return to a base, at their own risk.

#### MAYSON MAGNIFICENT AS GREY SOX BLANK TWINS

**P Derek Mayson** achieved his own personal triple crown in leading his **Vancouver Grey Sox** to a surprising 2-0 shutout of the Ontario Champion

Kitchener Hallman Rivershark Twins. The game was knotted at do-nuts in the fifth as Mayson duelled Twins hard-throwing P Don Scott. With none out, Sox loaded the bases in the B5, but Scott maintained his composure, inducing an infield ground ball. On the fielder's choice force-out at home, Mayson easily moved to 3B and quietly bided his time a few paces down the 3rd base line. With a pause

in the action as the Twins re-grouped for the next batter, Mayson scampered home uncontested.

Time-out had not been called and Mayson's headsup play proved to be the go-ahead and eventual winning run. In B6 Mayson punctuated the day with a



home-run "automatic" that cleared the centre field fence. He completed his triple-threat outing, going the full 7-inning distance on the mound, taming the Twins offensive roster who appeared to take the day off.

The Tale of **JUMBO** (from issue #1) Jumbo was an African elephant, born in 1861 in the French Sudan. He was exported to France in 1863 and then to London Zoo in 1865, where he became famous for giving rides to visitors. Jumbo's name is from a Swahili word, jumbe, which means "chief." Unfortunately, Jumbo grew bored in London and began to "act up".

Jumbo was sold by the London Zoo in 1882 to the "The Greatest Show on Earth" - the Barnum & Bailey Circus, for \$10,000 and shipped to New York City. In New York, the ship was met by thousands of onlookers who wanted to catch a glimpse of the 12 foot high "monster". He was big, but not a monster. Jumbo became very even tempered in New York. He became the headliner of the B&B Circus and was featured on most of the Circus' posters.
