Opening Ceremonies to officially launch tourney



Evolution of Johnathan Baker

In 2006, Johnathan Baker, an 11-year old local minor softball player addressed the ISC Hall of Fame breakfast, sharing how much passion he had for the sport. Even at that tender age, he had been embracing softball for more than half of his life. His first taste was as a four-year old in t-ball competition, "graduating" to fastball when he turned six.

His remarks had an impact on the seasoned audience of fastball

stakeholders, and his style revealed impressive potential for his future.

And Johnathan had dreams – dreams of suiting up for his country. Flash forward to 2014, and Johnathan, has reached the ultimate pinnacle of success for a teen-age softball phenom. In July, having just turned 19, Johnny competed with Team Canada at the world junior championships in Whitehorse Yukon. "It's an unbelievable feeling — it's a dream come true," said Baker in an

interview with the Kitchener Post. "Ever since I started playing ball, this has been one of my dreams."

It's quite a feat to be named to the Team Canada junior roster, but Johnny's ultimate goal is to be considered – and selected – to play for Canada's national senior men's team.

And that may be just what Canada needs for the future "country vs country" match-ups, dominated by Australia and New Zealand for the past decade.

While enjoying a summer respite from his sport management classes at Brock University, Johnathan competes with his hometown squad from the Kitchener Fastball League - the Tri City Blue Jays.

ISC 2002 – St. Joseph Frontier Casino prevails - Kitchener first Ontario community to host tournament



In 2002, Kitchener hosted the first ISC tournament to be held in Ontario, following a seven-year courtship after the initial bid w as made in Sioux City in 1995.

Tournament Chair **Tom Clancy** recruited an enthusiastic and competent corps of volunteers to manage the varied components of the event, and over the nine days of competition, the total attendance was recorded as slightly more than 40,000.

The odds-on favored team was the defending champion Broken Bow NE

Travelers, who had also finished 2nd in 1999 & 2000 and had an abundance of momentum, confidence and a stable of highly skilled players on the roster. The Travelers easily won their pool and took three-in-a-row in the playoff bracket to advance to the championship game.

Meanwhile, in the dreaded "lower bracket", the host Waterloo Hallman Twins were on a collision course to meet another small budget Frontier Casino team from St. Joseph MO. Both teams had been relegated to the "one life left" round, Twins losing 3-1 to **Gerald Muizelaar**

and the Travelers, while St. Joseph fell 1-0 to **Todd Martin** and The Farm Tavern of Madison WI.

On Saturday afternoon, with upwards of 6,000 fans in the park, the host Twins with **Trevor Wardell** on the mound, battled strongly against veteran **Doug Middleton** of St. Joe. A hauntingly memorable fly ball fell safely in "no man's land" to give St. Joe a 10-inning 1-0 win to advance to the final. Twins finished in 3rd spot, then the team's best-ever placement.

. In the Championship tilt against the undefeated Travelers, St. Joseph's **Michael White** was superb, scattering three hits as the Frontier Casino prevailed 3-0. White was the tourney's Outstanding Pitcher, with a 6-0 record and allowing only two earned runs in 44 innings.

Waterloo Twins, noted always for strong "D" was the top defensive team committing just one error in 172 put-outs.

The First Team All World pitchers were White and Muizelaar (5-0) and joined by Waterloo's **Mike Piechnik** (5-1), while 2nd Team All-World hurlers were **Todd Martin** (4-0 The Farm Tavern); Middleton (4-1) and **Jamie Simpson** (4-0 Owen Sound Selects).

Twins catcher **Craig Crawford** was also named to the 2^{nd} All-World Team.

Chris Miljavic of St. Joseph was the Most Valuable Player, batting .432 and leading the tourney with 16 rbis.
