











Twins outlasted the Gators 13-10, and with the loss Gators Greg Garrity and Blair Setford leave the diamond for the last time in the 2014 Tournament.

Twins match-up with the revamped and new-look Toronto Gators was still not finalized. Trailing 13-9 in B7, Gators 3B **Tyler Wright** walked, CF **Ben Oka** singled (Enoka's four hits went for the "cycle", a rarity in the sport), OF **Dustin Houtz** singled scoring Wright and setting the stage for additional dramatics. With two out and the game on the line, **Greg** 

Garrity, who had assumed pitching chores for the Gators, positioned himself in the batter's box. Representing the tying run in a 13-10 game is memorable, and Garrity, a batter of renown and very capable of stroking a home run had the Gators season in his grasp. Twin 3<sup>rd</sup> pitcher of the day, **Ryan French** knew the consequences of an errant wheel-house pitch based on Garrity's reputation and prowess. French was cagey, inticing Garrity's rip at the ball to result in a fly

out to 1<sup>st</sup> base. Thus ended the slugfest – a troubling night-mare for opposing managers Twins' **Steve Kooser** and Gators' **Blair Setford**,

Gators finish 10<sup>th</sup> and the host Twins are alive for Day #7.

In the evening nightcap #5 seeded Scarborough ON Force started strongly, with Andy Skelton, Donny Hale and Jake Taylor notching hits in B1 off #1 seeded Hill United Chiefs P Adam Folkard, staking the Force to an early 1-0 lead. In T4, Chiefs' 1B Steve Mullaley's hard hit twisting flare to right field resulted in a three-base error, allowing Mullaley to eventually score on Mark Johnson's fielder's choice to tie the game at a run apiece. Force OFs Dave Brownhill and Craig Buttar lit up Folkard with solo dingers in B4 and B5, and an upset appeared to be in the cards for the Force. In T6, Chiefs Nick Shailes singled and Mullaley launched a centre-field torpedo to tie the game at three, . Jason Hill (back from a hand injury after being hit by pitch) duplicated Mullaley's automatic and Chiefs were up 4-3. P Max Montero replaced Force starter Don Scott and got two quick Ks. With two out, Chiefs were not to be denied, and the flood gates opened as C Jason Sanford homered, followed by a single from Craig Crawford, Brad Ezekiel's walk, hits by Jeff Ellsowrth, Shailes again and Mullaley' second home run of the evening... and the inning!!!.

### Chiefs 10 Force 3.

The nightcap, with first pitch at 10:40 pm, saw P Ramon Jones (3-0) strike out 17 in leading PA Power to a 2-1 nail-biter over Cal A's. Argentinian OF Manuel Goday's 4<sup>th</sup> inning HR was the difference.

Also winning right to play today were the Swashbucklers, Gremlins and Kegel Knights.
