Time for a Canadian Club as Toronto Gators Win ISC World Title

KIMBERLY - Darren Zack made it sound like a stroll in the park.

The big Toronto 'Gators' right-hander had just thrown his third straight game Sunday during the 47th International Softball Congress World Fastpitch Tournament at Kimberly's Sunset Point Park.

His final gem was a 2-1 victory over twice-defending champion National Health Care Discount of Sioux City, Iowa, for the 1993 ISC World Tournament championship. It was his eighth victory of the tournament—an ISC record.

"I just listened to my catcher (Bruce Casselman). I put the ball where it was supposed to go," said Zack, who yielded only 13 hits in 21 innings Sunday. "I don't know if I got tired or not. We beat an awesome team today. They say I'm the best pitcher in the world. I don't know about that, but we're the best."

After pitching the 'Gators (78-10) to a 2-0 win over Larry Miller Toyota of Salt Lake City for the losers' bracket title, Zack hurled the underdog and crowd favorite 'Gators to a 6-1 win over NHCD (87-8), stopping its 18-game ISC tournament win streak.

In the finale, the 'Gators broke a 1-1 tie in the bottom of the seventh off lefty Mike Piechnik to claim the ISC's top team prize.

Pinch-hitter Steve Price started things off with a double.

"I was just told to go in and try to get on," said Price, a pitcher who was batting for the first time in the tournament. "I knew we were going to get a run with the heart of the lineup coming up.

"We were on a mission this week. We have the best pitcher in the world and he threw his heart for us. We knew we had to get him some runs."

Bob Rath followed with a routine fly to right, but Tod Stevenson dropped it as he turned his attention to making an accurate throw to third. Rath went to second on the error and Price moved to third.

Terry Challis was intentionally walked to load the bases. Brian Paton then gave the Canadian team its first ISC championship with a long fly ball over a drawn-in NHCD outfield.

Paton said his game-winning hit came on a rise ball. "He (Piechnik) was getting me on the change the time before," said Paton. "I did a lot of thinking before I went up there that last time."

Piechnik said he kept to his game plan after Price's double.

"You can't change a thing in that situation," said Piechnik. "You still have to believe in yourself and your team. You've got to keep your composure and give it your best."

Both teams had opportunities throughout the game. NHCD took a 1-0 lead in the fourth when Mark Sorenson hit a towering homer to left.

"You can't be happy with just one run," said Sorenson. "I guess we just sat back. We thought that Piechnik might shut them down after we got that one run. I think we just sat back too early."

The 'Gators tied it in the fifth when Challis hit a one-out triple and Adam Smith followed with a two-out single off NHCD third baseman Marty Kernaghan's glove.

"We had a few injuries (including centerfielder Bill Boyer who broke the thumb on his throwing hand (Saturday) but they just outplayed us today," said NHCD manager Russ Boice. "Their pitcher was hot. The biggest change since we played them last is that their catcher (Casselman) called a lot better game than their old catcher before him. He called for more changeups.

"Nothing's forever," added Boice, whose team had won four of the last five ISC titles prior to Sunday. "You can't stay on top. Once you get there it's hard to stay up there. We got to where we wanted to be today. They had to beat us twice and they beat us twice. You got to give them a lot of credit."

A two-run fourth off NHCD starter Marty Grant gave the 'Gators all the runs they needed during the 6-1 win in the two teams first meeting Sunday.

Paton and Smith got infield hits and, after an infield grounder, Casselman bounced a two-run single to right.

The 'Gators added four in the sixth to put the game out of reach.

"We kept putting the ball in play against some world-class pitchers," said 'Gators manager Bob Richardson.

Then he was asked about his own pitcher.

"Did I think Darren could do it today?" Richardson said, pondering the question. "I know he's got it in his belly. He's an unbelievable thrower and he supports the entire team.

"He just a champion."

ISC HALL OF FAME RULES

CATEGORIES

Members shall be selected in four categories — a) Players, b) Managers, c) Administrators and Officials, d) Sponsors and Contributors.

QUALIFICATIONS

Player candidates must have demonstrated outstanding ability during their playing years in ISC tournaments and ISC affiliated leagues, must have been inactive for at least three years or have reached their fortieth birthday if still active, must have played in at least five World Tournaments and must have been named to the All-World (All-American) team at least once.

Managers must have managed at least ten years in the World Tournament and must have finished in the top ten at least four times.

Administrator candidates must have at least seven years service with the ISC and must have demonstrated exemplary concern for the ISC and the game of fast pitch softball.

Umpires and other officials must have at least seven years service at ISC World Tournaments or with ISC affiliated leagues.

The fourth category honors those who have contributed greatly of their energy and resources in support of the ISC and fast pitch softball.

NOMINATIONS

Nominations may be submitted by any interested party, but each nomination must be endorsed by a member of the Board of Directors.

All nominations must be in writing and must be in the hands of the Chairman of the Hall of Fame Committee before May 1 to be considered during that year. Nominations received after the deadline will not be considered until the following year.

The written nomination should be in two parts — a) biographical information on the nominee and b) documents and statistics in support of the nominee's qualifications.

ELECTION

Election of new members will be made at the annual Board of Directors Meeting.

The Hall of Fame Committee will submit no more than five nominees from each category for consideration at the annual meeting. No more than six new members will be elected each year (two in the first category, one in the second, two in the third and one in the fourth).

INDUCTION

New members will be inducted into the Hall of Fame at the annual World Tournament the year following their election.

A plaque will be presented to each new member commemorating his membership in the ISC Hall of Fame.

ISC HALL OF FAME UPDATE

Six new members of the ISC Hall of Fame will be inducted on Sunday, August 14 at the ISC World Tournament in Summerside, PEI, Canada. Alan Colglazier and James Kennemer enter the Hall in the players category, Frank Arrigoni and Floyd Hammen in the administrator division, Rod Peterson in the new manager category and Dave Ball in the special Recognition of Service area. Colglazier pitched 27 ISC World Tournament victories and made three All-World teams. Kennemer was a five-time All-World catcher and was the Leading Hitter (.400) in 1963. Arrigoni has served as both area and travel league commissioner for Northern California and managed RKT of Fresno in World Tournament play. Hammen, the Wisconsin area commissioner, has been Northern Vice-President and played in several World Tournaments. Peterson is the manager/sponsor of The Farm Tavern of Madison, Wisconsin. Although never winning a world title, The Farm finished third twice, 1982 and 1987. Ball was the first ISC travel league commissioner; his Paramount Chevrolet team of Downey, California won the 1964 ISC World Tournament.

Peter Meredith vaulted onto the top rung of the all-time ISC World Tournament winning pitcher list when he hurled his Larry H. Miller Toyota team of Salt Lake City, Utah to six wins last year in Kimberly. The big right-hander now has 42 World Tournament victories, four more than living legend Ty Stofflet. ISC Hall of Famer Stofflet, still the leading left-hander with 38 wins, worked in two World Tournament games last year but failed to win one. The only active hurlers on the horizon with a reasonable chance of catching Meredith are Michael White with 36 victories and Brad Underwood who has 26 wins over a ten-year span.

ISC WORLD TOURNAMENT RECORDS UPDATE

Will anyone ever hit better in an ISC World Tournament than Mike Weaver of Ft. Worth, Texas did in 1979 in Bakersfield, Calif.? In five games with the Tarrant Glass Engineers, Weaver had 12 hits in 15 at bats for an almost unbelievable .800 average. Two of his hits were home runs, and he collected seven RBIs. Boomer Brush of the Clearwater (Fla.) Bombers had seven RBIs in one game last year to put his name in the book alongside those of Paul Smith (1956) and Eric Isenhardt (1991). No player had ever hit three home runs in an ISC World Tournament game until Dan Cronkright of the Midland (Mich.) Explorers did it last year against Minot, North Dakota. ISC statistician Art Cashion added Barry Penman's name to the book this year after discovering the Vancouver (B.C.) Magicians' catcher had 139 putouts in 1992 in Salt Lake City while catching Darren Zack. That tops the 126 putouts Art Tolfree of Midland had in the 1981 tournament in Saginaw, Michigan when he caught Peter Finn in that famous 34 inning game in which Finn struck out 64 batters.

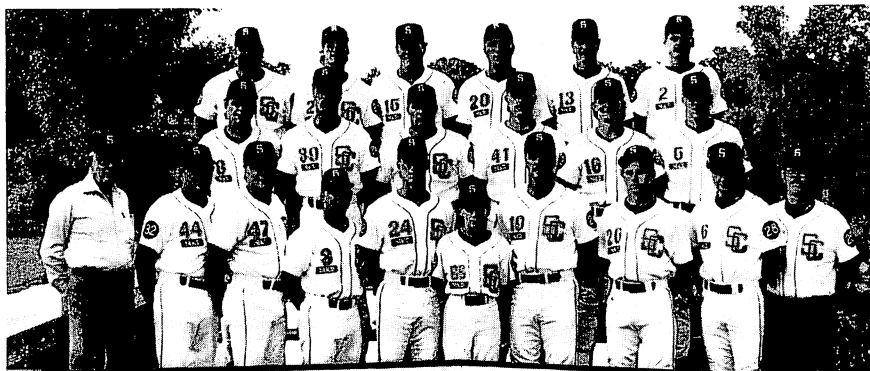

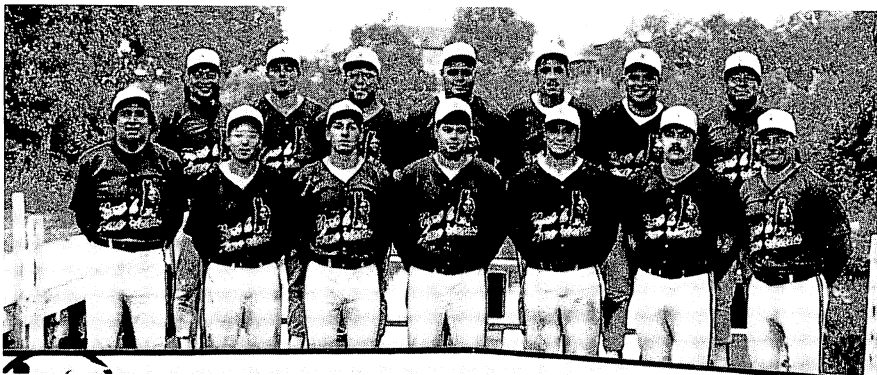

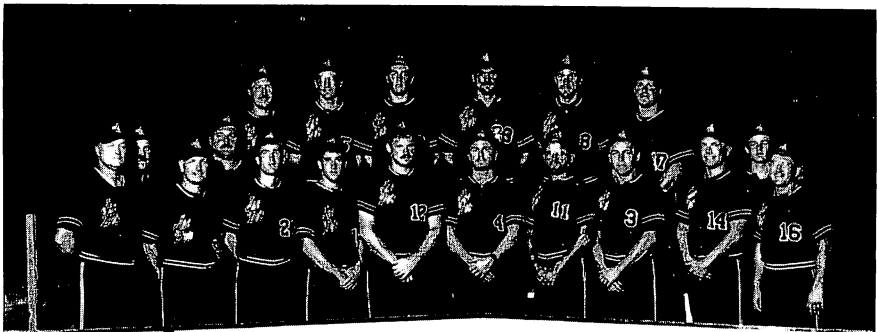

HISTORICAL NOTE: The National Softball Congress was founded in 1947 by LARRY WALKER of Phoenix, Arizona. Walker and others, including CARROL FORBES of Greeley, Colorado, were dissatisfied with some of the Amateur Softball Association's policies. The NSC held championships for men and women.

In December of 1950, Forbes, a former president of the NSC, split with Walker and formed a new organization, the International Softball League, for men only.

The NSC and ISL held separate championships from 1951 until 1957 when the NSC ceased operations. Forbes brought some of the NSC's administrators into his group and renamed it the INTERNATIONAL SOFTBALL CONGRESS.

ISC HIGHLIGHTS

The ISC is working hand-in-hand with the North American Fastpitch Association (NAFA) in promoting fastpitch softball in North America. NAFA Executive Director Pat Bucknell of Olympia, Washington has been the guest of the ISC Board of Directors at the last two ISC World Tournaments, and he has spoken before the Board on both occasions. Under certain conditions NAFA offers national tournament berths to the runners-up in ISC area tournaments and ISC travel leagues. "Open" or "major" teams are not eligible for NAFA play. The ISC looks forward optimistically to an ongoing cooperative relationship with NAFA. At presstime, one new ISC commissioner had been named. Rick Pauley of Tampa, Florida has replaced Bill Van Dine as Florida area commissioner. Van Dine resigned after many years of faithful service to the ISC as World Tournament Director, World Tournament Committee Chairman and area commissioner. The rapid growth of the ISC Youth Program under the directorship of Wayne Fisher has dictated an expansion from two to four North American Championships this season - two 23 and under and two 19 and under tournaments. 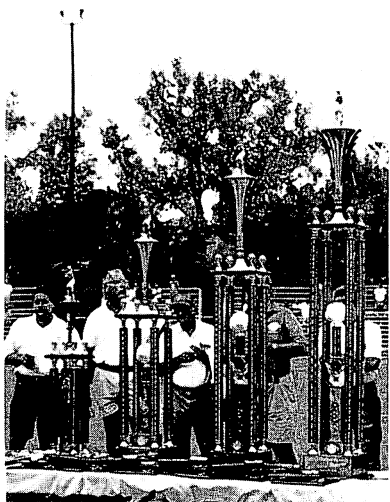

INTERNATIONAL SOFTBALL CONGRESS, INC.

Articles of Incorporation and By-Laws

NAME

The name of this organization shall be the International Softball Congress.

PURPOSE

The purpose of the International Softball Congress shall be to create an interest in and promote strictly amateur softball, to keep the game clean and free from objectionable features, to make it a sport that will be attractive to lovers of all clean competitive sports, and to provide a series of games that will lead up to city, district, area and world championships.

OFFICERS

The Officers of the International Softball Congress shall be President, Secretary, Treasurer and as many Regional Vice-Presidents as are necessary. The Executive Committee shall consist of the officers elected at the annual meeting and The Immediate Past President. The Board of Directors shall be composed of all officers and duly appointed Area, Travel League and At-Large Commissioners in accordance with the currently adopted Constitution and By-Laws of the ISC. The Immediate Past President shall be the Chairman of the Executive Committee. All officers elected to a new term shall take office 30 days after being elected.

EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

The Executive Director shall be appointed by the Board of Directors for a term of five years subject to periodic review and evaluation by the Executive Committee. The Board of Directors will also have the power of removal for cause, i.e. inability to function, misappropriation of funds, etc. The Executive Director shall not hold a commissionership. The Executive Director shall not have a vote. The Executive Director shall conduct all the official business of the International Softball Congress with the assistance of the Executive Committee as needed. He shall coordinate all divisions of the ISC; serve as the General Manager of all ISC operations; send or cause to be sent bulletins of interest to the membership; maintain the corporate and business office of the ISC; promote ISC on an international level; publish or cause to be published the annual yearbook and guide of the ISC; receive and receipt all monies and make all disbursements with periodic statement to the Treasurer; appoint Area, Travel League and At-Large Commissioners; and make all other decisions with the concurrence of the Executive Committee.

MANAGEMENT

Control of all business in the International Softball Congress shall be vested in the Executive Committee. Rule changes may be made only during the annual Board of Directors meeting and any changes will become effective 30 days after the annual meeting.

MEETINGS

The Board of Directors shall hold an annual meeting during the World Tournament. This meeting shall be conducted under Robert's Rule of Order, including election of officers. A mail or telegraphic vote may be taken; a quorum shall consist of six or more; any action shall require a majority vote. A special meeting may be called by the President, the time and place to be announced at least 30 days prior to the meeting. Board of Directors meeting will be open only to those who have paid their current commissioners dues.

DUTIES OF OFFICERS

PRESIDENT: The President shall preside at all meetings of the Board of Directors, appoint special committees, and assist the Executive Director.

PRESIDENT-PRO TEM: A President Pro-Tem appointed by the Executive Committee shall preside in place of the President in case the President is unable to function.

REGIONAL VICE-PRESIDENTS: Shall have jurisdiction over, and be responsible for, the Area and Travel League Commissioners within their regional areas.

SECRETARY: The Secretary shall record the minutes of all meetings and make them available for publication; conduct correspondence to assist the Executive Director; assist the Executive Director in promoting the ISC on an international level; and serve as a member of the Executive Committee.

TREASURER: The Treasurer shall receive and receipt monies from the Executive Director; issue checks for all accounts payable by the ISC; prepare a financial statement for all teams participating in ISC-sponsored tournaments; and prepare a financial statement for the annual meeting.

EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE: Shall have jurisdiction over all questions that may arise which are not specifically covered by the Constitution and By-laws of the ISC. Shall have authority to appoint Area and Travel League Commissioners. Shall have the authority to make an interim appointment when an elected officer is unable to serve his full term.

UMPIRE-IN-CHIEF: Shall interpret the official playing rules for ISC tournament play; obtain, organize and assign umpires for ISC World Tournaments; and assign a protest committee for each World Tournament game.

AREA AND TRAVEL LEAGUE COMMISSIONERS: 1. Shall have the authority to carry out and enforce the rules and regulations of the International Softball Congress within their own areas or travel leagues. 2. They are also responsible for the District Commissioners within their areas. 3. Area Commissioners and Commissioners of travel leagues must pay a membership fee of \$200.00. This fee must be paid no later than July 1 in order for their champion to participate in the ISC World Tournament. This is a guarantee that the Commissioner expects to run a first-class tournament in his area. The fee will not be returned. If the fee of \$200.00 is not paid by July 1, a penalty of \$25.00 will be added in order for any team to be represented. 4. Area and Travel League Commissioners shall furnish an appropriate trophy for the area or travel league champion. 5. Area Commissioners will be responsible for obtaining and submitting a \$200.00 forfeit fee to the ISC Executive Director with the team entry fee of \$75.00 into the World Tournament. These fees must be paid no later than July 1. The forfeit fee will be returned when the team has played its first game. 6. Travel League Commissioners will be responsible for obtaining and submitting a \$200.00 forfeit fee to the ISC Executive Director with the team entry fee of \$75.00 into the World Tournament. The defending championship team, the host team and any invited teams will pay \$100 World Tournament entry fee. These fees must be paid no later than July 1. The forfeit fee will be returned when the team has played its first game. 7. Shall send a report to ISC headquarters three times a year - pre-season, post-season and off-season. The post-season report shall be made immediately following the completion of travel leagues and/or area tournaments. The pre-season and post-season reports shall be made at the discretion of the individual commissioner.

Each commissioner is expected to follow the procedures and fulfill all obligations as outlined above. In the event of non-compliance or lack of performance of obligations by a Commissioner, the Executive Director shall direct the appropriate Vice-President to meet with the Commissioner and attempt to resolve the situation. If that contact does not resolve the situation of non-compliance, the Executive Director and/or the appropriate Vice-President shall request that the Commissioner respond to the Executive Committee. In the event that such situations as described cannot be resolved to the satisfaction of the Executive Committee, that Committee may, upon the recommendation of the Executive Director, mandate the removal of the Commissioner from the Board of Directors of the International Softball Congress.

SPECIAL NOTE: All leagues which are granted ISC Travel League status must extend the privilege of attendance, with voice, at all meetings of that organization to the ISC-appointed Travel League Commissioner.

Eligibility Rules

PRINCIPLE OF AMATEURISM

An amateur, for the purpose of competition in the organization, shall be one who competes solely for the pleasure, and physical, mental or social benefits he derives therefrom and who does not make his living playing softball.

1. No individual member of any team affiliated with the International Softball Congress shall receive remuneration. Expenses incurred for travel, meals and lodging will be reimbursed to sponsors only.

2. Any player who is an amateur softball player is eligible to participate in the program of the International Softball Congress provided he has not violated any of the rules pertaining to the eligibility of the individual.

3. No player shall be permitted to receive any award other than a trophy, charm or any other appropriate honor award in keeping with his achievement.

4. No player becoming ineligible in any area will be permitted to play with any other area holding membership in the International Softball Congress until he has been cleared by the area commissioner where the violation occurred.

5. No one shall be permitted to participate in the program of the ISC who has misused any funds or has equipment in his possession belonging to the ISC or any of its sponsors.

6. Teams must be composed of amateur players according to the rules of the International Softball Congress.

7. No player shall be permitted to enter more than one District or Area tournament under the jurisdiction of the International Softball Congress. EXCEPTION: Players participating in the Youth Program are also eligible for District, Area and Travel League play.

8. If a player is an undergraduate high school or college student, the rules and regulations of the association of schools and colleges shall govern the student. Examples: NCAA, NAIA, National Federation of State High School Associations, University Interscholastic League of Texas, etc.

9. RESIDENCY-

a. **PLAYERS OUTSIDE OF AREA** - If a player wishes to play in an ISC area outside of his geographic area of residence, whether that area be under ISC jurisdiction or not, he must file a letter of intent with ISC headquarters by May 1 annually. Upon approval of the letter of intent by the ISC Executive Director, the out-of-area player will be bound to the approved area and/or travel league for the entire current season and cannot return to play in ISC programs in his area or any other area or travel league until the following season.

Approved out-of-area players are eligible to be picked up by the approved area or travel league champion for ISC World Tournament play.

Notification of approved out-of-area players will be made to the proper commissioners by the Executive Director.

Approved out-of-area players must play in their approved tournament to be eligible for World Tournament play. In the case of travel league teams **and host team** approved out-of-area players must play in at least six games (exceptions must be approved by the ISC Executive Director) to be eligible for World Tournament play.

If a player signs a letter of intent and does not play in the approved area by June 1, he can notify the ISC Executive Director for a withdrawal of his letter of intent.

b. **AREA PLAYERS** - Other than players approved in 9a, all players must be bona fide residents as of May 1 of the area governing the team with which a player competes. A temporary vacation residence does not qualify as a bona fide place of residence. Transfer of employment to another area is acceptable until June 15 of the current season.

Any player moving to another area or travel league after May 1 of the current year and wishing to play in an ISC tournament or travel league shall make it known and be approved by the ISC Executive Director not later than June 15. This rule shall also apply to player changes for the Host Team and the Defending Champions. It shall be the responsibility of both the commissioner and the player to get clearance before playing with another team after moving to another area or travel league. All commissioners shall receive a list of players who have been approved to play for another team after having moved to another area or travel league. The Executive Committee shall make the decision, and in no case shall anyone play if not approved by June 15.

AREA

Any team that is a winner of a district tournament may enter the area tournament. The city in which the area tournament takes place may be represented by a Host City entry; this team may be chosen by invitation or elimination at the discretion of the Area Commissioner. In the event there are not enough teams to make a good bracket, the Area Commissioner may invite any high-ranking teams. If there is not a sufficient number of teams to hold district tournaments, the Area Commissioner may hold an area tournament by invitation.

Members of a sanctioned travel league champion are ineligible to participate in an area tournament. Members of Area Champions must play with their teams only.

WORLD

The defending World Championship team shall have the privilege of defending its world title by invitation, providing said team has nine players on its roster from the previous year that have not played in any of the area elimination tournaments of the current year. The roster with the nine players must be turned into the Executive Director by July 1. The city in which the World Tournament takes place may be represented by a Host City entry; the team may be chosen by invitation or elimination at the discretion of the Executive Committee. The champions of the Western Softball Congress and approved State Travel Leagues may enter the World Tournament. With the exception of the Defending Champions, Host Team, WSC and Travel League Champions, only Area Champions will be permitted to enter the World Tournament. All teams must pay the entry fee.

Team Rosters

AREA

The official team roster shall be limited to 18 amateur players. After a team has qualified to compete in the area tournament, only two additions are permitted. These additions must be selected from only players who have played in the same district tournament. Teams entering the area tournament by invitation shall not be permitted to use any players that have been previously eliminated in district tournament play. In areas where there are no district tournaments, teams entering the area tournament shall use only players from within that recognized geographical area. In case of unrepresented border area residents, all players or teams may be cleared by the Area Commissioner involved. Players must be approved by the area tournament deadline, and in no case shall they play in more than one area tournament.

WORLD

The official team roster shall be limited to 18 amateur players. After a team has won the area championship or travel league championship, thus qualifying for the World Tournament; five replacements will be permitted. Members of the other teams in the area tournament may be picked up by champions. Members of teams participating in area tournaments, not selected by the champions, may then be picked up by the Travel League winner. Players who have participated on teams or in leagues during the current year, and could not participate in the area tournament and are otherwise eligible, may be selected. Rule 9 under "Eligibility Rules" must be followed.

Tournament Regulations

DISTRICT AND AREA

All district and area tournaments shall be under the jurisdiction of the Area Commissioner. The Area Commissioner shall determine the site and dates of all tournaments within his jurisdiction

WORLD

World Tournament shall be under the jurisdiction of the Executive Committee of the ISC. Double-elimination system shall be used. World tournament will be conducted annually upon dates set by the Executive Committee.

Awards

AREA

All area champions shall receive an appropriate award presented by the Area Commissioner. Other awards may be presented by the tournament committee so long as they meet the rules of the International Softball Congress.

WORLD

Appropriate awards shall be presented at the conclusion of the World Tournament to the following; championship team, runner-up team, third-place team, team displaying best sportsmanship, best-dressed team, most valuable player, leading pitcher, leading hitter, and player with most RBI's. Members of the championship team will receive individual awards. Fifteen (15) players chosen on the ISC All-World team will receive appropriate awards. An ISC All-World second team of fifteen (15) players shall also receive awards.

All-Tournament Teams

An all-tournament team shall be selected from teams participating in all tournaments under the jurisdiction of the International Softball Congress. Fifteen players shall be named: three pitchers, two catchers, five infielders, four outfielders, and a designated hitter. The tournament director and the Executive Director shall tabulate all ballots and announce the official All-World team at the close of the World Tournament. Ballots shall be accepted from each tournament official working along press row. Only players having participated in four or more games shall be considered. The batting champion must have a minimum of 10 times at bat or 12 official appearances as a batter.

Protests

All protests in tournament play must be handled at the time protest occurs, as the tournament cannot be delayed. Any player found to be ineligible shall be ruled out of further play from the point of proof of ineligibility. If anyone knows an ineligible player is being used by a team, he should report it to the director in charge and not wait until the tournament has gone so far that the schedule will be delayed by such a protest. A protest committee will be designated at all ISC tournaments.

OFFICIAL SOFTBALL

The official softball of the ISC shall be any that meets the specifications prescribed by the Official Softball Playing Rules. See list of softballs advertised in this ISC Yearbook and Guide.

OFFICIAL RULES

All softball games played in the ISC shall be played according to the Official Softball Playing Rules. These rules may be secured from any sporting goods dealer. (See "Special Rules for ISC Tournament" in this book.)

How to Enter ISC Tournaments

Contact your Area or District Commissioner or apply directly to the Regional Vice-President. If more information is needed, contact any officer listed in the front of this book.

Entry Fees

DISTRICT AND AREA

Any team entering an ISC District or Area Tournament shall pay an entry fee. The amount shall be set by the commissioner in charge.

WORLD

The Area Commissioner and Travel League Commissioner shall forward a fee of \$275.00, paid by the team, with the entry of the area champion and Travel League champion into the the World Tournament. \$200.00 of the fee will be returned as soon as the team has played its first game. In the event a team does not meet its obligation, the total fee will be retained. All team entry and forfeit fees for the ISC World Tournament must be paid by July 1, or the team will not be allowed to take part. Each qualifying team to an ISC World Tournament must meet its obligations to the ISC or entry will not be accepted. This includes not playing in any other tournament until eliminated from the ISC World Tournament.

Distribution of Gross Gate Receipts

DISTRICT AND AREA TOURNAMENTS

District and area tournaments shall be played in well-fenced parks where an admission can be charged at the gate. Where it is possible to play such tournaments, it is recommended the sponsoring agent be given 50 percent of the gate receipts for operating expenses and that the traveling teams and the director in charge be given the balance.

WORLD TOURNAMENT

60 percent of the World Tournament guarantee or 50 percent of the gate receipts, whichever is greater, less admission tax, shall be awarded to the sponsors of competing teams coming from outside the area (state where the tournament is played). The sponsor's share shall be divided as follows: One-half shall be prorated by the number of miles traveled by each team. The balance shall be prorated by the number of days each team plays in the tournament. Teams playing the first day (Friday) shall receive expense from that day, and

all other teams shall receive expense money from the second day (Saturday) of the tournament. In no event shall any sponsor be permitted to receive an amount in excess of the team's actual expense for travel, meals and lodging.

SPECIAL RULES FOR ISC TOURNAMENTS

The International Softball Congress will not assume responsibility for personal injury to personnel of any of its members, and it will not be liable for property loss in connection with its program.

If a team winning a district or area tournament does not wish to participate further, it will not receive any expense money. The ISC director in charge of any tournament may send the runner-up in the event the winner does not wish to participate further.

Any team entering an ISC tournament that does not play in said tournament until it has been eliminated will not receive any portion of the gate receipts.

In the event any team has fewer than 12 active players on the World Tournament roster, 1/12 of the travel allowance will be withheld for each player missing.

All players and coaches must be dressed in full playing uniform, including caps of like style and color, for all ISC tournament games and ISC World Tournament opening ceremonies. Any team failing to comply will be fined \$100 which will be withheld from its travel allowance.

When a ball is fouled out of play, the umpire will give the pitcher another ball; and that ball must be played until it is fouled out of play or the umpire feels it is unfit for further play.

All games shall start at rainout point in case of delay, regardless of time.

Tournament rosters shall not be changed for any reason after they have been turned in at a time to be designated by the official in charge.

Only bats that are stamped "Official Softball" by the manufacturer may be used.

In areas where the Area Commissioner is involved in any way with a team, a three-man committee shall be appointed by the Executive Director to help with the conduct of the tournament. All commissioners must send a copy of their completed area tournament bracket (prior to World Tournament) or travel league schedule (prior to start of league play) to the Executive Director, Area Vice-President and either area tournament or travel league committee chairman each season.

Area Tournament or Travel Leagues with fewer than six teams cannot qualify for the ISC World Tournament. All sanctioned travel leagues must play a minimum of three rounds and/or a minimum of 18 games per team per season to qualify.

The "re-entry" rule as adopted by the Official Softball Playing Rules will apply to ISC-sanctioned tournaments or travel leagues.

INTERNATIONAL SOFTBALL CONGRESS DESIGNATED BATTER RULE

a. A player may be designated to bat for any player. A designated batter may bat in any position in the lineup but must be selected prior to the game and must be included in the lineup cards presented to the umpire. When a designated batter is used, the tenth player will be referred to as the NON-batter and listed as the tenth (defensive) player on the lineup cards.

b. It is not mandatory to use a designated batter.

c. The designated batter may be used defensively, continuing to bat in the same position in the batting order. The new player or former NON-batter must then bat in place of the replaced player. In that case, the manager must designate their positions in the batting order.

d. Once a designated batter assumes a defensive position, the move shall terminate the designated batter role for the remainder of the game. The NON-batter may be substituted for any player in the game, and the designated batter must then assume a defensive position unless the designated batter was the player replaced by the NON-batter. The move shall terminate the designated batter role for the remainder of the game.

e. A runner or a batter may be substituted for the designated batter. A replaced designated batter shall be allowed to re-enter the game in any capacity. A player substituted for the designated NON-batter must assume the role of the NON-batter.

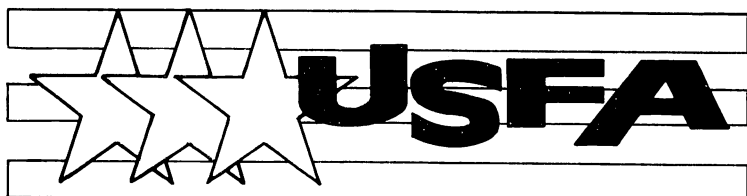
