Over the past decade, this event has donated \$110,000 to the Oxford County Chapter of the Canadian Cancer Society, as well as helped raise thousands of dollars for the Innerkip Parks & Recreation Committee and the Canadian Mental Health Association (CMHA) in memory of a former friend, ball player and fellow umpire Gord Marshall.

For 2016, the Innerkip Umpires Association are pleased to announce that for the second year in a row, the Oxford County Chapter of the CMHA has been chosen as this year's beneficiary of proceeds from this event. This charity was chosen to once again show support to families from Innerkip and the surrounding area, who have been affected by mental illness.

Innerkip Umpire and acting Tournament Chairman Brad Hallock said, "It is our pleasure to again partner with the CMHA for this year's tournament. Our goal as an association is to raise funds that will help bring awareness and education to those that may be seeking help."

Oxford County CMHA executive director Mike McMahon adds, "the Oxford Branch is focused on offering walk-in services for those with mental health and addiction needs. All community-generated funding, including the 13th annual Gord Marshall Memorial Ladies' Fastball Tournament supports Oxford County Walk-In Counseling."
